Key verses

Colossians 3:23. Put your heart and soul into every activity you do, as though you are doing it for the Lord himself and not merely for others.

Colossians 3:17. Let every activity of your lives and every word that comes from your lips be drenched with the beauty of our Lord Jesus, the Anointed One. And bring your constant praise to God the Father because of what Christ has done for you!

1st Timothy 5:25. It is the same way with good works [as it is for sin]: Even if they are not known at first, they will eventually be recognized and acknowledged.

Titus 2:7a. Above all, set yourself apart as a model of a life nobly lived.

Key verses

Ephesians 6:6-8. Always do what is right and not only when others are watching, so that you may please Christ as his servants by doing his will.

7 Serve your employers wholeheartedly and with love, as though you were serving Christ and not men.

8 Be assured that anything you do that is beautiful and excellent will be repaid by our Lord, whether you are an employee or an employer.
